**Article Structure:** These guidelines describe the preparation procedure of the camera-ready manuscript of the paper accepted for presentation at the "SEE 2021" conference. The authors are requested to follow these instructions in order to maintain high quality standards. The writing should be clear, concise, and grammatically correct. Papers with poor English will be returned to the author for improvement. If necessary, ask a native speaker to check and improve the writing style before submission.

Papers size and format – the manuscript must have a minimum length of 6 pages and cannot exceed 15 pages, including with tables, illustrations and references. Papers not complying with that requirement will not be accepted. Each paper size should be A4 (21.0cm×29.7cm) and the following margins should be set, left margin 2cm, Right margin 2cm, top margin 2.5 cm and bottom margin 2.5 cm. All fonts must be in Times New Roman, and the font sizes of the title, authors' names, affiliations, abstract, and keywords are bold 14pt, 12pt, 10pt, Italic 10pt, and 10pt, respectively. The main text of the paper uses Times New Roman 12pt font with single spacing and justified throughout.

Subdivision - numbered sections: Divide your article into clearly defined and numbered sections. Subsections should be numbered 1.1 (then 1.1.1, 1.1.2, ...), 1.2, etc. (the abstract is not included in section numbering). Use this numbering also for internal cross-referencing: do not just refer to 'the text'. Any subsection may be given a brief heading. Each heading should appear on its own separate line. Heading must be in bold Times New Roman 12pt font]

#### Introduction

State the objectives of the work and provide an adequate background, avoiding a detailed literature survey or a summary of the results. Abbreviations and acronyms should be used sparsely and should be defined the first time they are used in the text, even after they have been defined in the abstract.

### Material and methods

Provide sufficient detail to allow the work to be reproduced. Methods already published should be indicated by a reference: only relevant modifications should be described. If equations are used,

they should be referred to in the text.

**Equations:** they should be written using Microsoft Equation and numbered consecutively as they appear within the text. Equation numbers should be Arabic numerals enclosed in parentheses. They should be cited in the text as, for example, Eq. (1), or Eqs. (1)-(3). Punctuate equations with commas or periods when they are part of a sentence

#### **Results**

Results should be clear and concise. Quantitative results should be expressed using SI units. Tables and figures should be referred to in the text.

**Tables and figures:** All tables and figures should be placed as close as possible after their first mention in the text. Each table should be in MSWord only with consistent decimals. Large figures and tables may span across the page but their distortion to adjust and/or cover the page should be avoided. Scanned or digital images are to be used (e.g. line art, photos etc.) if the output resolution is at least 600 dpi. All spellings and annotations (numbers, letters, symbols and captions) should conform to their usage in the text. Table captions should be above the tables, figure captions should be below the figures; they should be referred to in the text as, for example, Table 1, or Tables 1-2; Fig. 1, or Figs. 1-3.

#### **Discussion**

This section should explore the significance of the results of the work, not repeat them. A combined Results and Discussion section is often appropriate. Avoid extensive citations and discussion of published literature.

## **Conclusion**

The main conclusions of the study should be presented in a short Conclusions section

# Acknowledgement

Collate acknowledgements in a separate section at the end of the article before the references and do not, therefore, include them on the title page, as a footnote to the title or otherwise. List here those individuals who provided help during the research (e.g., providing language help, writing assistance or proof reading the article, etc.).

#### References

Please provide in this last section of your paper all references cited in the main text of your manuscript.

#### **Citations and References:**

In the text: Please use the Author-Date method of citation (Last name of author, Date of publication) inserted in the text in an appropriate place. For more than two authors, add "et al." after the name of the second author, for example: (Frits, 1976; Pandey and Shukla, 2003; Kungsuwan et al., 1996). If the author's name is part of the sentence, only the date is placed in parentheses: "Frits (1976) argued that…"

#### In the list of references:

References should be arranged first alphabetically and then further sorted chronologically if necessary. More than one reference from the same author(s) in the same year must be identified by the letters 'a', 'b', 'c', etc., placed after the year of publication. Examples:
